Why Are Teens Vaping?

MORE TEENS VAPE BECAUSE OF:

Advertising and marketing efforts appealing to youth



MORE TEENS VAPE BECAUSE OF:

Easy to conceal shapes like USB drives, pens and everyday items





MORE TEENS VAPE BECAUSE OF:

Many teens use e-cigarettes because they believe they are less harmful than other tobacco products

Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine, which is **HIGHLY ADDICTIVE** and can **HARM BRAIN DEVELOPMENT**, which continues until age 25.5
