



Supporting Childcare

Buckeye Health Plan, in partnership with its parent company Centene, donated \$65,000 to support the operation of the YWCA Columbus pandemic child care center during the coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis. Four hundred disaster kits containing essential first-aid supplies will also be shipped to the YWCA to hand out to essential workers and at local shelters.

The donation will support families who are working essential jobs and using the Safe and Sound Child Care Center by covering additional costs of childcare, meal services and activities. The funding is crucial to allow the YWCA to increase their services to families during this pandemic.
